



## How it works:

- Click the button below to open the UN Dangerous Goods List
- Press 'Control F' on your computer keyboard. A search box will pop up on your screen.
- Type the common and chemical name of the item you are importing or exporting into the search box.
  - Note : try searching for various synonyms and similar descriptions of your product to be sure you are not missing it.
- Press F3 OR the small right arrow next to the search box OR scroll down to your tariff code.
- If you cannot find your goods on this list it is not classified as dangerous goods.
